9. The reason for the decision and other alternative options considered and rejected:

In March 2020 the Council took delivery of new refuse collection vehicles and introduced new waste collection rounds. The fleet these vehicles replaced now requires disposal. Officers have previously used a commercial vehicle auction which specialises in the disposal of vehicles which include gritters, sweepers, and refuse collection vehicles, with access to over 25,000 buyers. This method of disposal therefore provides more opportunity to achieve best value for the asset as opposed to

advertising the vehicle in trade press, or private sale, particularly as current social distancing measures restrict face to face sales.

The advice from the industry is that due to a change in current market demands for used refuse collection vehicles, potentially linked to the current pandemic where production of new vehicles has been delayed; some of our redundant vehicles should be auctioned now. It is proposed that nine of our vehicles are auctioned now to achieve the best possible sale price. Having viewed some of the vehicles, the auctioneer has given an indicative sale price of £4,000 per vehicle based on an assessment of their current condition based on experience of selling similar types of vehicles. Therefore the combined value of all these vehicles is expected to achieve a capital receipt of £36,000.

Another alternative is to not to use commercial vehicle auction, however the Council does not have the infrastructure in place to facilitate an inhouse auction arrangement. This option has been rejected.
