Collaborating with Citizens Advice Lindsey is an opportunity to deliver support based on evidence of need and local demand for advice, to help East Lindsey residents strengthen their economic resilience and wellbeing.

East Lindsey District Council has established relationship with Citizens Advice Lindsey who offer free, independent, impartial and confidential advice. A partnership project will create capacity in their service to meet increase in local needs and support <u>ELDC</u> <u>strategic prioritiy</u> to improve quality of opportunity across the district and in targeted areas.
