

Promoting the PAM and encouraging questions

Prior to the meeting on 30 May, communication activity was coordinated to encourage the public to submit questions.



Social media clips

After the meeting, short, topical clips of the PAM was shared on OPCC social media channels with a link to watch the full recording on You Tube.

Subtitles were included on the video clips. This not makes the clips more accessible, but also increases engagement as the majority of social media users consume video content directly from their timeline without volume. The top video clips on social media included the following topics:

- Use of Integrated Offender Management (IOM) to reduce offending
 (102 views)

999 BSL service

'999 BSL' is a new service that gives deaf British Sign Language (BSL) users the option to contact the emergency services using BSL via the 999 BSL website and app.

We continue to promote this service across all social media channels and have provided the Safer Together Team with information and resources to share with their community networks.

Support for victims in the workplace

Victim Lines campaign

Aim: Victims of crime (assault, harassment and hate crime) in the workplace are aware of emotional support available and how to access it via Victim Lines

Target audience: Med/large businesses in Lincolnshire with customer-facing workforce of approximately 20+ (e.g. larger shops, supermarkets, bars, pubs)



Strategy: Create toolkit for employers/managers to help them support staff that have been the victim of crime in the workplace and signpost correctly and effectively.

Publication of Youth Commission Report 2021-22

Press release being developed about the report, to also include information about future plans for 'Lincolnshire Strong Voices' - the OPCC project to engage with young people, giving details about how they can get involved.
