Remember to be careful who you share your personal information with online.

If you receive a request from a stranger to connect online, always stop and think. Criminals can use your information to commit identity theft. It is always important to cancel any lost or stolen cards immediately.

If transactions appear on your bank statement that you don't recognise or you receive letters about loans or cards you didn't apply for you could be a victim and should contact your bank or card company immediately on a number that you know is genuine such as the one on their website or the back of your card.

POSTING PERSONAL INFO ONLINE? Don't let criminals build A picture of you!

Criminals search online to find out personal details about you and build a better picture of who you are. They use this information to pretend to be you and open bank accounts, apply for credit cards and get loans in your name.

Who can see your details? Provide as little personal information about yourself online as possible and only accept social media invitations from people you know. If you're worried your personal information has been stolen, contact your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud.






Top posts Death of Her Majesty the Queen Dementia Band Launch Take Five—personal info online






Number of posts/tweets this month was lower due to the 12 day social media blackout after the passing of Her Majesty The Queen; resulting in overall engagement to be down.

Top posts University Freshers New students in Lincoln Victim of Harassment


