Background

1. At its meeting on the 6 September 2013 the Lincolnshire Police and Crime Panel (the Panel) adopted a Principles of Engagement Protocol with the local Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs). The Protocol aims to:
 - build strong ties and aid close working between the Panel and CSPs;
 - support the Panel in effectively scrutinising the Police and Crime Commissioner for Lincolnshire in relation to his responsibilities for the delivery of community safety and crime reduction

2. Part 4 of the Protocol states that;

'CSP Chairs will be invited to meetings of the Police and Crime Panel on an annual basis to engage in an open discussion about the impact of the Commissioner in each district and to review the relevance of the latest iteration of the Principles for Engagement.'

3. Claire Seabourne, Safer Communities Partnership & Commissioning Manager at Lincolnshire County Council will be presenting the report which is attached as **Appendix A**.

4. The Panel should note that in undertaking its business today it is not scrutinising the work of the Community Safety Partnerships but is assuring itself that the Commissioner is delivering his community safety and crime reduction responsibilities in an effective manner.
