'Financial First Aid' / COVID Recovery Project:



The project initially supported East Lindsey residents to navigate their financial recovery following COVID pandemic. This is a preventative approach, to help residents to access advice before financial stress escalates to unmanageable debt and poor health.

'Financial First Aid' has provided additional capacity for the service to manage increase in demand. This project is being extended for a further 2 years due to ongoing costs of living pressures on households seeking to maximise income and reduce spending.

As part of its strategic recovery plan, East Lindsey District Council identified the need for practical support to help people recover from the social and economic impact of the pandemic. 'Financial First Aid' was initially established as part of the Council's COVID recovery, but ongoing cost of living pressures mean more residents are needing advice on benefit entitlements, how to manage household budgets, access affordable credit or address unmanageable debt.

Aims of Financial First Aid partnership project:

- Maximise household income
- Increase economic resilience
- Encourage financial capability
- Tackle disadvantage
- Promote independence and wellbeing

East Lindsey District Council has established relationship with Citizens Advice Lindsey who offer free, independent, impartial and confidential advice. This partnership project creates capacity in their service to meet increase in local needs. It supports <a href="ELDC strategic priority"><u>ELDC strategic priority</u></a> to improve quality of opportunity across the district and the new Lincolnshire District Led Health and Wellbeing Strategy objective 'Economic inclusion: Reducing economic inequality and alleviating poverty as a fundamental driver for improving mental and physical health and wellbeing'.
