

PROPOSED PREMISES LICENCE CONDITIONS

The Blind Tiger Bar, 1-2 Pawnshop Passage, Mercer Row, Louth. LN11 9JQ

General

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

A tamper resistant CCTV system shall be installed, maintained in working order and operated at the premises.

CCTV images shall be retained for a period of no less than 28 days.

Recordings of incidents at the premises must be made secure for inspection by the Police, or Licensing Authority, and provided on lawful request. This means that a member of staff shall be available within 24 hours or by prior appointment who can operate the CCTV system and provide recordings in accordance with lawful requirements

Public Safety

A refusals book, or electronic record, shall be kept recording all instances where service of alcohol is refused. Records to be retained for at least 12 months and shall be made available for inspection to the Police, or Authorised Officers of a Responsible Authority, upon request.

There shall be provided at the premises door supervisors to such a number, if any, as the management of the premises consider are sufficient to control the entry of persons to the premises and for the keeping of order in the premises when they are used for a licensable activity.

A record/log book shall be kept on the premises by the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor. The record shall be retained for a minimum period of 12 months from date of completion and contain the following details:

- a) The door supervisor's name;
- b) His/Her Security Industry Authority (SIA) licence number;
- c) The time and date he/she commenced and concluded their duty;
- d) The door supervisors shall sign each entry; and
- e) The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or other authorised person shall also endorse each entry as having checked the authenticity of the individual door supervisor.

An incident book shall be kept at the premise in which details of crime and/or disorder that relate to, or are linked with, licensable activities at the premises shall be recorded.

The incident book shall be retained for a minimum period of 12 months from date of completion and contain the following details:

- a) time, date and location of incident.
- b) nature of the incident
- c) the result of the incident.
- d) action taken to prevent further such incidents.
- e) each entry shall be signed by the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or other responsible person employed at the premises and so authorised by the DPS.

The incident book shall be made available to the Police, or Authorised Officers of the Licensing Authority, upon request. Each entry shall be retained for a minimum period of 12 months from date of completion.

Patrons shall not be allowed to enter or leave the premises whilst in the possession of alcoholic drink in unsealed containers. For clarity, leaving the premises includes leaving for any reason whether temporarily or otherwise. This condition does not apply to any areas that are set aside for the consumption of alcohol where the premises provide outdoor seating for customers that is not within any licensed area defined on the licensing plan. Any such areas are to be monitored and there should be no unnecessary delays in clearing any used glassware and/or bottles.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

When live or recorded music is taking place after 2300 Hours any external windows in areas where live or recorded music is taking place shall be kept closed until the entertainment is no longer taking place, and any door(s) leading from the areas where the regulated entertainment is taking place to outside be closed for the same period save for entry and exit to the premises (*NB: this may not in all cases be the last door out of the premises and may be one within a lobby or corridor*).

The Protection of Children from Harm

Challenge 21 shall be implemented, and a proof of age policy shall be applied with the accepted means of proof of age being:

- a) Passport
- b) Photo Driving Licence
- c) A recognised valid photo-id card bearing the PASS hologram

All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive training in the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives, offences committed under the Act and conditions of the Premises Licence. Written records of this training shall be retained for a period of no less than 12 months and made available upon request to Police and Authorised Officers of the Licensing Authority.

No activities are proposed that may give rise to concern in respect of children but should any activities occur that may give rise to concern in respect of children then suitable measures and restrictions shall be implemented.
