- 1.1 The Constitution Working Party works with the Monitoring Officer to assist him with reviewing and monitoring the Council's Constitution.
- 1.2 The Working Party meets as required to review the Council's Constitution to ensure it remains fit for purpose and reports any proposed changes to the Audit & Governance Committee (with a view to an appropriate report being made by the Audit & Governance Committee to the Council on any changes proposed).
- 1.3 The Audit and Governance Committee's Terms of Reference set out that the Constitution Working Party shall comprise of three elected members drawn from different political groups. The members of the Working Party prior to the May 2023 District Election were Cllr Grover (Conservative Party), Cllr Jackson (Labour Party) and Cllr Makinson-Sanders (East Lindsey Independents).
- 1.4 Post election the Audit and Governance Committee is asked to appoint three members to the Constitution Working Party for the next 4-year term or until a vacancy arises.
